First, since this will be the last issue of the Summary before the Christmas holiday, I would like to wish all of our residents and their families a very happy holiday season. Please remember the Giving Tree and the Oregon Food Bank donation barrels in the Clubhouse lobby as part of your holiday celebration.

Second, since our community runs on volunteers, I would like to recognize several of our active volunteers. The Landscape Committee, under the leadership of Art Krueger, and the Architectural Committee, under the leadership of Warren Grabinski, have worked with Board Directors Hal Thiemann and Bob Nottingham to combine the Landscape Manual and the Architectural Manual into one document to clarify the needs for approval of changes. Through their efforts, we have sold 55 properties this year and are targeting to sell 60 by year end, which is amazing given the current economic atmosphere. I would also like to congratulate the Craft Club on their successful Holiday Bazaar. GREAT job to the above mentioned organizations and individuals.

Lastly, again since our association is run by volunteers, I would like to request that you consider a volunteer position in 2012. If you had a job or jobs in your lifetime which included skills that might be helpful to the Board or the Administrator or a Committee or Club, please let the SCA office know. ## **November 14, 2011**

Present: Pfeifer, Kerns, Nottingham, Thiemann, Sacconaghi, Vogel, Wilcox, Froeber; Absent: DeWild, Parkinson. Minutes approved from October 10th meeting.

**Golf Pro Shop Report - Lindsey:** Play statistics reviewed for October and year-to-date. 'Public Golf' sign has been taken down off of 98<sup>th</sup>. Public Annual Golf Tag will be offered again in 2012, same price of \$650, advertised in Oregonian, on website and in Golf Pro Shop. Confirmed no punch card discount promotions this year. Participating with Alpha Golf Card, starting January 1<sup>st</sup>. Considering PGA/OGA junior golf event here. Reminder that credit on the books must be used by end of year.

## **Treasurer's Report - Nottingham:**

Operating Account: October Total Income of \$29,600; October Total Expenditures of \$62,872.15; Cash on hand as of 10/31/11 of \$140,900.47. Reserve Account: General Reserve Balance as of 10/31/11: \$163,186.46; New Buyers Fee income for October: \$6,000; New Buyers Fee account balance as of 10/31/11: \$84,124.63; Total General Reserves plus New Buyers Fee account: \$247,311.09. Check registers reviewed for October. Motion made, seconded and approved to accept the entire Treasurer's report.

## **Correspondence - Administrator:**

Correspondence related to parking clarification for golf carts in Clubhouse parking lot, one unknown occupant letter, and official variances written.

**Control:** Motion made, seconded and approved to add month of December.

## **Administrator's Report:**

- Carpet cleaning on 11/17. Based on carpet report from third party inspector, pursuing arbitration clause with our legal council against the contractor.

Oregonian article about Summerfield.

- Fall Summit date for Board and sub-associations is Friday, November 18<sup>th</sup>.
- Oregon Food Bank donation barrels are here through December 27<sup>th</sup>.
- Giving Tree for foster children is here through December 15<sup>th</sup>.

## **Report from Darlene Young - City Liaison:**

No update on Durham Road maintenance. Motion made, seconded and approved to edit Darlene's draft letter to the City asking for an update and to also confirm SCA Board attendance at the December 13<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting.

## **New Business: A. Architectural & Landscape Committee Manual & Change Request Proposal:**

Motion made, seconded and approved to accept new dual manual and change request. Updated versions will be available in the Clubhouse lobby and on website.

## **B. Durham Road Brick Wall Repair Proposal:**

Motion made, seconded and approved to proceed with proposal to repair one section of wall, pending updated vendor contract to show corrected name and pending written permission from homeowner for access to property.

## **C. Employee Manual Approval:**

Motion made, seconded and approved to accept manual as submitted, with effective date of 1/1/12. Administrator to work with each employee on identifying changes that pertain to them.

## **D. Preliminary 2012 Operating Budget Approval:**

Motion made, seconded and approved (one denial) to accept preliminary 2012 operating budget which includes the 2012 tentative annual assessments and fees. Information posted on hallway bulletin board and on poster in lobby.

## **Directors Round Table:**

**Sacconaghi** - Determined that the dishwasher electrical was attached to the water fountain, so we have a water fountain issue not a dishwasher issue. Deck railing information passed on to Architectural Committee for review. Divider walls in Game Room and Ballroom repaired thanks to new member Dewey

Hamilton. Exploring new chair / table options for Clubhouse and set-up procedures.

**Nottingham** - Thank you to Landscape & Architectural Committees for the new combined manual and Change Request. The Treasurer's Advisory Committee continuing through December 31<sup>st</sup> and working on restructuring the financial statements and streamlining the entries for the payroll withholdings.

**Vogel** - Greens Committee met on 11/2 and discussed tree trimming and bunker option. Marketing Committee continuing work on website, 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday, golf and signage.

**Thiemann** - Motion made, seconded and approved for Kathleen O'Shea to join Architectural Committee as new member. Continued work on recruitment of volunteers. Purchased and installed ceiling heater for pool house, electrician to hook it all up next. Recommend that SCA explore card access system, perhaps tying in with a new security system. Flu Shot Clinic had low turnout, probably due to being so late in the season. Next year will be earlier and will consider opening up to community, not just SCA residents.

**Kerns** - Continued work on east end drainage, meeting with soil engineer. Exploring common area irrigation with vendor TruGreen to determine needs and issues. Craft Club's Holiday Bazaar had a very successful Saturday, however overall revenues were down, but they still made a generous \$350 donation to Meals on Wheels.

**Wilcox** - Working with SCALT on job description to better prepare for creation of new group. For Newcomers, many welcome packets have been distributed, particularly due to high occupancy in the Apartments. Will explore bids for a presentation projector. Found a volunteer to help coordinate more volunteers and will work toward participating in April's National Volunteer Appreciation Month. Considering video conferencing or Skype during winter absences.

Meeting adjourned. Next Board Meeting is December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2011 at 9 AM in the Conference Room.

## Neighborhood Watch Committee

In the October *Summary*, there was an insert asking if your smoke alarms are working and requesting you check them. This month we are continuing to suggest other ways to keep your home and yourself safe.

### IF THERE IS A FIRE...WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?

- Have an escape route pre-planned with two ways out of each room.
- Ensure all windows or doors open easily.
- Make sure you can safely reach the ground from an escape window.
- At night, close your bedroom door. Closed doors act as a barrier to smoke and fire. Consider closing all doors whenever you leave your home.
- If there is a fire—get out fast but don't walk upright, crawl out. Deadly smoke kills and smoke rises, so stay low!
- If you own a cell phone, place it near you at night. In case of fire, take it outside with you.
- Once outside—stay out, never go back in! Only after you are outside, call 911, either from your cell phone or a neighbor's house.

When the fire department arrives, the first thing they do is circle the outside of the house looking for any survivors, at windows, decks or roofs.

I want to thank the Area Coordinators and Block Captains for visiting the homes in their neighborhood and passing out the TVF&R Smoke Alarm brochures and the Home Fire Escape Worksheet. This was an ideal time to update our Neighborhood Watch records. There are a few areas that haven't been covered very well in the past few years, but we are doing our best to rectify this situation. If you are asked to be a Block Captain or an Area Coordinator, please volunteer. The areas are divided into small manageable areas, so no one person is asked to do a large time consuming job. The work needed should only take an hour or two of your time **each year** and is done in your immediate neighborhood. The benefits help our community stay safe.
