## POOL NEWS

"They call the wind Mariah" and she visited Summerfield on Mother's Day. One of our brand-new umbrellas next to the pump house was no competition for Mariah. It was flipped inside out and destroyed.

Here are the lessons:

1. If you put up an umbrella, please put it back down when you leave the pool area.
2. How much is too much wind to even risk putting up a pool umbrella? If the wind is causing trees to drop debris on Summerfield Drive, as it did on Mother's Day, it's too windy to use any pool umbrella.
3. The pool budget does not have contingency funds to replace the umbrella. Umbrellas have typically lasted up to 3 or 4 years before budgeted replacement.
4. When opening or closing umbrellas next to the fence please avoid getting the metal stays caught in the fence.

Remember no food or beverages, except water in a non-glass container, are allowed. Please see Pool rules as a yearly reminder on page 11.

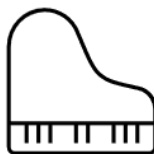

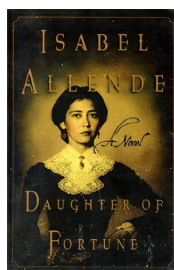




## BOOK CLUB

## SUMMERFIELD POOL RULES

As many of you have discovered by now, the Pool is OPEN for the season. Residents can enjoy the pool at all hours, except during pool maintenance. There are many chairs, chaise lounges, tables and umbrellas to make your pool visit more enjoyable. Please respect the furniture and put it back as you found it and close up the umbrellas when you leave.

The pool is monitored by a group of volunteers who form the Pool Committee. They do checks on the area and chemical testing on weekends.

There is a lost and found out on the pool deck –so anything left behind out there should end up in the L&F box out there and most likely not brought inside.

Signing in is important. When you visit the pool, write your name on the clipboard as well as any guests that may be with you.

Observance of these rules will insure all pool users a safe and pleasant pool experience.

- There is NO LIFEGUARD on duty
- The Swimming Pool area is a NON-SMOKING facility
- All persons should take a cleansing shower before entering the Pool
- Guests must be accompanied by an SCA Resident, Limit 4 guests per household, and must sign in
- Guests under 18 are allowed from **11 AM—1 PM and 6 PM—7:30 PM**; safety ropes must be up during these hours as per Oregon State Law
- Diving is not allowed
- Not allowed in the Pool: street clothes, bandages, and pool toys except adults using a noodle during non-youth time, persons with a communicable disease
- Not allowed in the Pool area: food, drinks except water, glass containers, pets, running, cannonballing or roughhousing, guests in diapers, including swim diapers, playing with the life-saving equipment

The Pool is closed Tuesday mornings from 7 AM—9 AM for Pool Maintenance

The Pool CAN NOT be reserved for private parties

Last year we experienced a lot of unfortunate closures due to an unforeseen electrical issue that was tricky to resolve. We understand that was a burden, bummer, and inconvenience to many.
